Faculty and staff news

Professors **Jonathan Peters**, **Genelle Belmas** and **Peter Bobkowski** have accepted an offer

from the Fordham Intellectual Property, Media & Entertainment Law Journal, the top-ranked law journal nationally in the area of arts and entertainment, to publish their article "A Paper Shield? Whether State Privilege Protections Apply to Student Journalists." They found that most privilege schemes exclude student journalists, and they called for legislative action.

Bobkowski and **Belmas** also have had accepted for publication their article, "Mixed Message Media: Girls' Voices and Civic Engagement in Student Journalism," in the journal *Girlhood Studies*. This research is the first empirical look at the differences between student journalist boys' and girls' experiences with administrative censorship or self-censorship. The article will appear in the April 2017 issue.

Peters spoke over the weekend at the 2016 Law & Media Conference, hosted by the Ohio State Bar Association. He moderated a panel on Strategic Lawsuits Against Public Participation, and he served as a panelist to discuss campus free speech.

Associate Professor David Guth welcomed **Tim Carpenter** (below), the statehouse bureau chief for the Topeka Capital-Journal, as a guest speaker in JOUR 201 "Campaign 2016: The Media, Politics and Persuasion" class. Carpenter reminded students that the election races closest to them -- local and state races -- are the ones that will have the greatest effect on their lives. He also told students that they should vote. "Don't underestimate the power that you have," Carpenter said.


